





DRILL 1/2" HOLES IN VEHICLE BUMPER AT LOCATIONS MARKED IN STEP 3. ON 2-DOOR MODELS, DRILL TWO (2) 1"

ACCESS HOLES AS SHOWN IN FIGURE 2.


RAISE HITCH BACK INTO POSITION. INSTALL 1/2" FASTENERS AS SHOWN IN FIGURE 1.

INSTALL 3/8" U-BOLT THROUGH TOW HOOK AND HITCH BRACKET AS SHOWN ABOVE. USE BLOCK (6484) IF NEEDED SO

THAT RESEIVER IS LEVEL OR TILTED SLIGHTLY FORWARD. FASTEN WITH FLAT WASHERS AND NUTS AS SHOWN. MAKE SURE FLAT WASHERS DO NOT OVERLAP.

3/8-16 U-BOLT GR2 OPTIONAL BLOCK (6484) FLAT WASHER LOCK NUT

TIGHTEN 3/8 GR2 FASTENERS TO 20 LB.-FT.
TIGHTEN 1/2 GR5 FASTENERS TO 75 LB.-FT.
